



State Update

State Deputy's Message—New Year = New Initiatives

First of all, I want to thank all the Brothers who attended the Organizational Meeting on 7 July at St James the Just in Ogden which kicked off our new fraternal year. We also had in attendance our State Chaplain Fr Erik Richtsteig, Membership Program Coordinator Ray Lopez, and District Deputies. I also want to thank GK Wayne Welninski for providing training to the Financial Secretaries. Along with some standard reports and information delivered for the benefit of the membership, two new initiatives were provided that are of great importance starting this year, namely Faith in Action and Online Membership.

Ryan Gravely, State Program Director, presented the new Faith in Action program model. "This model is an evolution of the Building the Domestic Church While Strengthening Our Parish initiative that was introduced in November 2015," Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson wrote in a letter to state deputies April 6. Faith in Action, the supreme knight explained, "embodies a simplified overall program structure, featuring four instead of six categories." It includes a strong call to action and focuses on programs in four categories: Faith, Family, Community and Life. Councils must know the new model reduces the requirements to earn the Columbian Award which recognizes excellence in programming and charitable outreach by completing four programs in each of the four categories. To earn the award, there is one required program in each category designed to enrich the spiritual life of the council, family and community. Specifically, these are the Spiritual Reflection Program, Consecration to the Holy Family, Helping Hands, and a Novena for Life. We must all understand and put into practice this new program model. Nick Nielson, Online Membership Chairman, presented this new initiative. This new fraternal program seeks to help the Order maintain sustainable long-term membership growth by providing the opportunity for membership throughout the modern man's life cycle. This streamlined alternative helps acclimate men to the Order. Once a man has joined online, we will then work to incorporate him into a council and get him fully integrated with its activities. FROM SUPREME: SPECIAL OLYMPICS: 50TH ANNIVERSARY

In June 1962, Eunice Kennedy Shriver – sister of brother Knight and President John F. Kennedy – held a summer day camp for young people with intellectual disabilities in her backyard. She was inspired to do something for this group of children after seeing limited opportunities for them to participate in athletic events. This was the revolutionary moment that eventually led to the first International Special Olympics Summer Games at Soldier Field in Chicago on July 20, 1968 – 50 years ago today – where about 1,000 athletes from the U.S. and Canada competed.

Since the first games, the Knights of Columbus have been there. Here are the highlights of the 50 year history between the Knights and Special Olympics:

Founding members of the Special Olympics were associated with the Knights of Columbus

- Eunice Kennedy Shriver's brother, John F. Kennedy, was a Knight. Her husband, Sargent Shriver, was also a Knight. He was a member of the Mater Dei Council 9774 in Rockville, Md.

The Knights have raised and donated more than \$600 million to the Special Olympics

- The Knights of Columbus has collected and given more than \$600 million to programs for people with intellectual and physical disabilities, with the Special Olympics being among the largest benefactors.

The Knights of Columbus has pledged to expand the Special Olympics

- In 2005, the Knights of Columbus pledged to raise \$1 million in a four year period to help grow the Special Olympics in North America. The Order also pledged increased volunteer support for state and local games, as well as help to expand the program to underserved countries. The Knights of Columbus has subsequently extended that commitment through 2016.

The Knights donated \$1.4 million for the 2015 Special Olympics World Summer Games in Los Angeles

- The Knights of Columbus donated \$1.4 million to cover the costs of athletes from the United States and Canada who travelled to the 2015 Special Olympics World Summer Games in Los Angeles.

Since 2014, Brother Knights have spent almost 4 million volunteer hours toward Special Olympics events

- In 2014, the Knights of Columbus spent a more than 800,000 volunteer hours. Every year since, the hours have increased. This past year, volunteer hours surpassed 1 million. In total, brother Knights spent 3,836,255 hours with the athletes. As Supreme Knight Carl Anderson stated, “We are leading the way not only in donating money, but in donating our personal time and effort.”

Online Membership

What It Does

1. **Provides A Faster Way to Join** - One of the most common objections to joining the Knights of Columbus is "I don't have time." Through Online Membership, the join process that can take as many as two months now takes five minutes.
2. **Offers A Digital Experience** - This initiative provides a new membership experience that is tailored to younger men and busier men who may not yet be ready for council-based membership. This low-pressure, low-commitment and digital experience meets men where they are, helps to form them as Catholic men, and enables us to bring more men into the fold.
3. **Provides An Amplified Message** - The Online Membership initiative is backed by a substantial marketing campaign that will find and work to convert prospective members.

What It Does NOT Do

1. **Does not change requirements for membership.** Membership in the Knights of Columbus remains open to practical Catholic men at least 18 years of age.
2. **Does not eliminate degrees.** Men who join online are non-degreed members. Once they are ready to convert to a local council, they are required to take the Admission degree.
3. **Does not eliminate councils.** The goal of online membership is to form men for committed, lifelong and council-based membership in the Knights of Columbus. In fact, Online Membership creates a pool of recruits for local councils to engage with.
4. **Does not eliminate dues.** Online Members are required to pay \$30 annual dues.
5. **Does not create a new class or type of member.** Online Members are members of the Knights of Columbus. They are non-degreed members, and they do not belong to local councils, but they are not provisional or partial members.

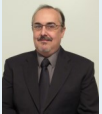

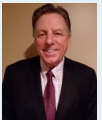

Over the past six years we have raised over 1.6 million dollars in support of the tuition assistance program to recruit and ordain Catholic priests to serve our military men and women worldwide. To date 46 men have entered the program.

As you know, there is a great shortage of Catholic Chaplains serving our military members and their families. There are 210 active Catholic Chaplains but the military needs another 800.

The need is great yet the Military Archdiocese does not have the funds to recruit and educate the many seminarian candidates willing to serve as chaplains. We need to raise an additional \$400,000 by June 20, 2020.

Allow me to quote His Excellency Archbishop Timothy Broglio of the Military Archdiocese when he said, “What a great job the Knights are doing. Thank you so very much for this support for our co-sponsored men! Thank you, too, for all the ways you and your fellow Knights serve the Needs of the AMS. Your generosity is a tremendous blessing to us and those who serve. We are very grateful.”

In the past I have asked state councils, local councils and assemblies, ladies auxiliaries and individuals for their support. Again I ask for a minimum of \$25.00 donation from all. I ask those state councils that have charitable funds available to be generous and donate what they can. Pass the “Helmet” at your next meeting or event and you will be surprised at the generosity of our members for this noble and urgent cause.
